Semester Registration Procedure

For Spring 2023 registration ONLY, all currently enrolled graduate students <u>will register online in</u> the Student Information System (SONIS).

Telephone assistance from the Registrar Office (624-8980) is available during normal business hours (8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday). E-mail to the Registrar will be answered the following business day. The Registrar's e-mail address is ausitn.w.blair@osfhealthcare.org. For registration questions, a list of contacts is included.

Academic Advisement:

- Advisement for Spring 2023 classes ends 10/27.
- All currently enrolled graduate students must meet individually in person with his/her Academic Advisor.
- It is the student's responsibility to make an appointment to see the advisor.
- Choose classes by checking the Spring 2023 Class Schedule for the classes you want and the time and location most convenient.
- Check prerequisites in the College Catalog or click on College website http://www.sfmccon.edu. Prerequisites must be met before you register for the course.
- When meeting with Academic Advisor is completed, the advisor is to release the 'hold' on registration so you will be able to access the spring courses online during your level's online registration dates. Before leaving the meeting make sure this has been done by your advisor.
- Students will not be able to register if they have delinquent financial obligations to the College or to financial aid programs.
- Class and clinical sections will be determined by registrations. The College reserves the
 right to limit enrollment in sections and to cancel a section for which there are insufficient
 registrations. The College reserves the right to change or adjust course and clinical or
 lab schedules of students, as needed.

WALK-IN REGISTRATION

Students who do not register online, submit Registration Forms, signed by Academic Advisor to Registrar's Office, Room 628 Monday-Friday between 8:00 am – 4:00 pm. Graduate students may submit signed Registration Forms to Vicki Craig, Room 626. Students using walk-in registration will receive confirmation of classes by email.

Registration and Student Account Implications:

- To assure timely receipt of billing statements and to allow time needed to complete financial arrangements, please register as early as possible.
- Student Account payment for Spring 2023 semester is December 9, 2022
- Students who register <u>after</u> the tuition/fee due date must make <u>immediate</u> payment arrangements in the Student Finance Office, Room 710
- Students who register late and have an unpaid account balance by the tuition/fee due date may experience:
 - * Delays in financial aid processing.
 - * \$25 monthly late charges on unpaid balance of account
 - * Hold on class attendance
 - * Unnecessary Stress!

Please allow several weeks to process financial aid

* Students enrolled in 6 credit hours or more may be eligible for federal student loans or other financial assistance. The FAFSA must be filed and financial aid process complete. (For more information, please contact the Student Finance Office (624-9932)

*OSF employees utilizing **Tuition Waiver**/Reimbursement Education benefits must complete the appropriate form and submit to OSF HR. *Special note: Waivers are applied to tuition only. All other fees are the student's responsibility.*







- 1. Other students will be registering at the same time. Course seats may fill up while you are in process.
- 2. You may register for all of your classes at once or you may register and finalize your courses one at a time
- 3. If you finalize a course and need to switch courses (or sections), you will need to complete and submit an Add/Drop Form through the Registrar's Office, Room 628.

^{**}Please understand that we will try to place you in the courses and sections you have selected, but remember there are no registration guarantees. If you are placed in a different section for any reason, you will be notified of the change.

Spring 2023 Course Offering:

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Graduate courses are online and offered in three (3) formats.

ASYNC-Courses are asynchronous (students and faculty ARE NOT in the course at the same time) and do not meet live at all.

The asynchronous format allows students to access the course and make their contributions on their own schedule. While the course has due dates for assignments and discussions, none of the class is conducted live. The asynchronous format is delivered using the College's learning management system (LMS). All assignments, discussions etc. are in the LMS.

HYBRID-Courses are mostly asynchronous (students and faculty ARE NOT in the course at the same time) but will meet *live* synchronously for some classes (students and faculty ARE IN the course at the same time) via a videoconferencing system called Adobe Connect during the first week and additional times during the semester.

The synchronous portion of the class allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of their home or office. The student's computer must have adequate Internet speed and be able to support the most current version of Adobe Flash Player. Students may need to purchase a webcam and microphone if these features are not built into the computer. Students are required to use an "appropriate headset" [USB connection, (instead of a jack), a noise cancelling microphone, and an inline mute/volume control] in all courses that use Adobe Connect. Doing so will improve audio quality for everyone in the class and may also help each student focus more on the discussion since the headset can screen out ambient noise in the student's environment. Faculty will notify student of live meeting dates; questions about meeting dates should be directed to the faculty teaching the course.

The asynchronous portion of the class will be conducted using the College's learning management system (LMS).

SYNC-Courses are synchronous (students and faculty ARE IN the course at the same time) and meet live each week via Adobe Connect videoconferencing.

The synchronous option allows students to attend class in a live "classroom" setting from the comfort of their home or office. The student's computer must have adequate Internet speed and be able to support the most current version of Adobe Flash Player. Students may need to purchase a webcam and microphone if these features are not built into the computer. Students are required to use an "appropriate headset" [USB connection, (instead of a jack), a noise cancelling microphone, and an inline mute/volume control] in all courses that use Adobe Connect. Doing so will improve audio quality for everyone in the class and may also help each student focus more on the discussion since the headset can screen out ambient noise in the student's environment.

<u>PRAC-Practicum courses are completed at a predetermined clinical site(s) with a preceptor(s).</u> Each practicum course requires completion of a different number of practicum hours. The number of required practicum hours is found in the course description located in the College Catalog (see sfmccon.edu).

Times for courses are in Central Standard Time (CST).
