VO TAG

For smaller vehicles like an ATV, buckle up and wear a helmet.

Other tips include:

Read the label before handling toxic materials, and have the poison control hotline handy.

Get any animal bite looked at by a health care provider.

Beat the heat by drinking lots of water and taking breaks.

Work with a buddy and bring a charged phone. If you work alone, let someone know your plans.
